General Information:

- Seating: We offer open, unreserved seating at all of our services.
- Prayerbooks: Thanks to the generosity of several donors, GJC now owns a congregational set of the new Rabbinical Assembly Mahzor Lev Shalem. If you pray in the Chary Service or Minyan Masorti, those books will be provided. Should you wish to purchase your own copy of Lev Shalem it's available in the Little Shop for \$50. Dorshei Derekh uses the Reconstructionist Mahzor Kol HaNeshamah, which is also available in the Little Shop for \$50.

Member Tickets

- All members in good standing (members who are current in their membership dues and financial obligations) receive tickets to our services. Tickets will arrive soon by mail.
- Membership in the Centre entitles the household to tickets for each adult. Tickets are not transferable.
- If you have an outstanding balance, please contact Gloria Geissler, our Finance Director, who will assist you with payment arrangements.

Guest Tickets & Youth Tickets

- Young people ages 16-22 who are children of members in good standing are entitled to free tickets for the High Holidays (Children under 16 do not need tickets). These tickets entitle the young person to join any of our adult services as well as other programming.
- Tickets for guests are available for a suggested contribution of \$200 each. This contribution can be applied toward membership if they choose to become members this year.
- Tickets are available for graduate students who are over age 22 and are children of members for \$36.

Reciprocity

- Germantown Jewish Centre participates in a High Holiday ticket reciprocity program, so if your guests are members at another synagogue, they are eligible for free tickets at GJC. We just need a letter from their synagogue stating that they are members in good standing.
- If you are traveling to another synagogue for the High Holidays, the GJC office can provide a letter to that synagogue to let them know that you are a member in good standing and that you should receive free High Holiday tickets.
